From Our SJA Welcome the Stranger Ministry

On October 17, 2016, a small group of parishioners hosted an event at SJA to try and approximate - in a very small way - the experience of crossing the U.S. border from Mexico as an undocumented person. Attendees of our event gathered in the church vestibule and were asked questions: "If you had to leave your home now and knew you couldn't return, what would you carry with you? Will you travel across the desert at night or in the daytime? What if the country you want to enter turns you away? How will you charge your phone? Will you bring your dog?" 'Border guards' were stationed in the hallway, and some people were detained and questioned as they tried to get to Hospitality Hall. We were forced to imagine the harsh reality of trying to begin a new life in the shadows, in fear of being found out.

This experience led to the ministry we know as Welcome the Stranger, and our mission is to stand in solidarity with immigrants, refugees and asylees. We accompany new Minnesotans (including families from Afghanistan, Rwanda, Ukraine and many other nations) as they adjust to life in the Twin Cities. We host conversations and movie nights to educate our community, and we advocate for just and humane immigration policies that respect human dignity and keep families united. We have organized delegations to the border, and to greater Minnesota. We welcome you to join us in one of the many opportunities we offer—contact Julie Madden at the Parish Center to get connected.

In 2020, Welcome the Stranger delegates engaged with community and faith leaders around Minnesota to learn from communities which had experienced an influx of new immigrants. In Worthington, we witnessed firsthand Fr. Jim Callahan's solidarity with immigrants in his parish of St. Mary's, and we visited the free community clinic that he co-founded to provide quality medical care to uninsured people (which received a Justice Grant of \$5000 from our SJA Outreach Fund last spring!).

Today, we introduce Fr. Jim Callahan, musicians, and parishioner leaders from the parish of St. Mary's in Worthington to all of you at SJA. Please stop by the Welcome Center after mass to meet our guests and to learn more about strengthening bridges between us and immigrant communities in outstate MN, and between us and faith communities who have welcomed and included immigrants in their midst.

In our gospel this morning, we will hear about the saving power of our faith, and we have seen the power of faith and the power of loving neighbors, to lift up and sustain those who are without a home, those who are without a country. Today, we hope that you have no fear for your safety in a community where you belong, among people who love you. We pray that your work is valued and that you have a living wage. We pray that your home is a place of refuge, of security, a place where you can truly rest. And we pray that together we may create this reality for all our brothers and sisters.
