A group of parishioners and staff convened a parish conversation on antiracism here at St. Joan of Arc. We ended up scheduling it for Wednesday, November 9, 2016. It was the night after the national election. Yep.

We did not know then that within the next few years, our country would be roiled by a surging wave of white Christian nationalism, as well as the murder of George Floyd, the ongoing dehumanization of immigrants, and an unprecedented polarization within our families, our communities, and our churches.

But the Holy Spirit knew that we were going to need each other to navigate the journey ahead, and that is what our antiracism ministry has continued to do. An incredible group of parishioner leaders has guided us, calling us together to examine our own stories, share our perspectives, and live into a new way of being Christian and human in the world.

Rev. Dr. Jacqui Lewis, who leads a congregation in New York that she describes as “multi-everything”, says: “The one we follow into mission and ministry – Jesus the Christ – was an avowed boundary-crosser. We are in good company when we lead the way on radical inclusion of those different from ourselves. The more we bump into the folks who are so-called ‘other,’ the more we are stretched, the more we are pulled out of bias and have new truths because we have tangible evidence of the beautiful, powerful creativity of our God who made all of this diversity for us to enjoy.”

Some of what we do:

We convene a monthly discussion on Zoom, currently examining the characteristics of White Supremacy Culture and its impact on our lives, individually and collectively - and exploring antidotes. As one participant shared with us, “I really appreciate the contemplative nature of the gatherings. It helps us to get out of our heads and into our hearts. And for racism to be overcome, our hearts have to change along with our heads.”

We continue to learn more about racism in the history and structures of our parish, our church, our neighborhood and out nation. If you haven't already, you should visit the Hennepin History Museum in Minneapolis, which has two powerful exhibits currently on display. One details the impact of the building of Highway 35W on South Minneapolis, and the other tells the story of the merging of Hale and Field schools just blocks from SJA.

In addition, we attend performing arts events and support businesses in BIPOC communities, and we build relationships with other local faith communities, including St. Peter's AME, the Church of Blessed Kateri, and St. Frances Cabrini. Watch the bulletin for a neighborhood event in November!
