Pastor's 2 Cents From: Fr Jim DeBruycker

Christ is Risen! Christ is Risen! Alleluia! Alleluia!

That's how the phone is answered for weeks after Easter at St. Mary's Greek Orthodox Church. Although, since they follow the Julian calendar rather than the Gregorian like the Roman Catholics their Easter Celebration is on May 5th this year we will have to wait a couple of weeks. But who cares? It's the remembrance which matters. I like the in-your-face proclamation of belief their receptionist gives.

I also like the orthodox icons of the Resurrection. They show Christ rising from the tomb. Next to him are usually two sarcophagi with Adam and Eve coming from their tombs sharing in the Resurrection. They are not just rising they are being pulled up out of their tombs by the risen Christ. Not only that, he has them by the wrists so they can't let go. Remember that part of the creed that says *he descended into hell, on the third day he rose from the dead*. What Jesus was doing was retroactively saving those who died before his coming. Adam and Eve have been forgiven? Paradise has been reinstated, the apple so to say, has been forgiven.

Of course that is our greatest hope that we will see our loved ones again and we can rejoice with them forever. As the hymn says:

No more crying there,
We are going to see the king,
No more crying there,
We are going to see the king...
Hallelujah, Hallelujah
We are goin to see the king

No more dying there,
We are going to see the king,
No more dying there,
We are going to see the king...
Hallelujah, Hallelujah
We are goin to see the king.

Of course the message of Easter is also a challenge: that until that final Resurrection, when all will come to peace and life, how do we create a kingdom of hope in our world today? So that death is merely a passage from one kingdom of peace to another kingdom of peace. That's our challenge.

Thanks to all who made this Easter celebration come alive. Especially those who celebrated the Easter sacraments of initiation.

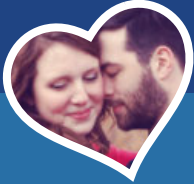

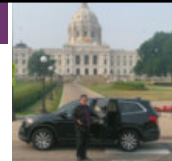
