Pastor's 2 Cents From: Fr Jim DeBruycker

First, thanks to everyone who made our Holy Week celebrations so joyous. Thanks to the musicians, sound and light people who led the way, our sacristans, decorators, and maintenance people who made sure everything was where it was supposed to be when it was supposed to be, to our performers and playwrights who put together such meaningful presentations, to our Seder families and our RCIA and CIC candidates and baptism families. Finally, thank you for your continued support of Saint Joan of Arc. The crowds were amazing, I talked to people from Long Island to San Diego and even a few from England.

Our Scripture readings continue to tell the Resurrection story and the forming of the Christian community. Our first reading tells us that the nascent community lived sharing all things equally, each according to their need. Try to sell \$60 bibles with that verse...unless you are Bernie Sanders. Sad to say, it would not catch on much past the Apostolic age.

John's Gospel tells us one of our favorite stories, doubting Thomas. Thomas actually is the fall guy for doubt in another gospel story when Jesus says "where I am going you will follow" and Thomas says, in the perfect setup, "where are you going?" Then Jesus gives the proclamation of who he is, "I Am, the way, the truth and the life." Am capitalized because it is pointing to his being the God of Abraham and Moses - remember the name God gave Himself from the burning bush.

Was Thomas' doubting an accident in the story? Many scholars think not. He is a vehicle for John to proclaim a powerful truth. Salvation was...IS an actual physical and historical event. It actually happened. It wasn't just a sensation of resurrection experienced by the disciples but it really happened. That is why Jesus is so insistent that Thomas actually touch the wounds and put his hand into his side -touch the Truth.

If you watched the PBS series the Power of Myth with Joseph Campbell and Bill Moyers you may remember Campbell spoke a lot about the Gospel of Thomas. Someone recently asked me why the Gospel of Thomas isn't in our Canon of Scripture. It has been declared a Gnostic Gospel. Much of the Thomas Gospel contains stories found in the four evangelists' Gospels but there is one major difference: Thomas' Jesus is a great guru, but he doesn't have to die. Salvation is more about meditation than action, anathema to John. Salvation takes place by Jesus' action in the world, his life and death. The response to that action by believers is not just thinking about it, but doing it. That is why his command and gift of the Church's ability to forgive is so powerful, Jesus has given the Church true power of forgiveness. Some scholars think the Gospel of John is a reprimand of the Thomas Gospel. For John, to believe is to act.


