Pastor's 2 Cents From: Fr Jim DeBruycker

This week's Gospel is almost a repeat of last week's Gospel, although this time we are hearing from Luke. Thomas is off the hook this week as all the disciples are incredulous that Jesus is real flesh and blood and not a ghost. To prove it he ate some fish and it must've digested because the disciples believed him and celebrated his return from the dead. His greeting once again was "peace be with you".

When Jesus offers peace, it means tranquility in your surroundings, but even more importantly, with your soul and spirit. Jesus wants to put his disciples and us at peace. He lets them know that the tragedy of his arrest and crucifixion was not a disaster but a means to an end: the forgiveness of sin. His death was a fulfillment, not a destruction of what the scriptures foretold about the Messiah.

The post-Easter readings are an explanation of who Jesus is. Through most of the year we hear stories and parables of Jesus' life but not so much who he really is. Although more than a few times it's suggested that someone who preaches justice for the oppressed and heals the afflicted must be from God. After Easter, especially in the Acts of the Apostles, we hear exactly who he is. Peter calls Him the 'author of life, the Holy One of God.' The martyr Steven, as he is being stoned, has a vision of Jesus standing at the throne of God. There is no mystery who Jesus is anymore, and the rest of Acts tells the story of how his Spirit entered into the Church and began to form it to this day.

It is important to remember that we are descendants in faith of those first believers. Although as we look around today, it seems like we have lost the Spirit, it's still here working. When we ask the question in any situation, "What would Jesus do?" we are again one with the Apostles and the 'seeking' Church, trying to create and find the kingdom of God. But we need the peace offered by Jesus to the Apostles, the knowledge that we are honest and living with integrity in this world as we seek. To seek in Christ is never ending.

It is with sadness and happiness for her that I announce the retirement of our Director of Music and Liturgy, Anna Vagle, who has decided it is time to hang up her baton. Anna has been a part of SJA since the 70s as a parishioner, musician, and finally as Music and Liturgy Director. It would be no exaggeration to say she was and is an integral part of the identity and spirit of SJA. She is looking at the end of June to be her last days as director, but not the end of her being a member of the SJA community. We are actively looking for someone who can continue to lead and create the musical legacy of SJA. And watch this space for news about a celebration honoring Anna.

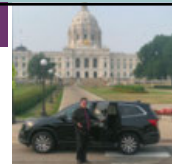
