Pastor's 2 Cents From: Fr Jim DeBruycker

I had an eventful week. Saturday, I went to a gathering looking at the history of Black Catholics in the US with presenters led by our own Cynthia Baily Manns as keynote speaker. Among other things, it proved Black Catholics do exist and as obvious as this sounds, personal experience at St. Leonard's has indicated that people are surprised there was such a person as a Black Catholic. Whenever I told someone I was pastor of St. Leonard of Port Maurice, the first question was, "Where is that?' When I told them it was created by Archbishop Murray for the Negro community, as Black Catholics were called in the 1930s, along with St. Martin's in North Minneapolis, the response was "Really? I thought all Blacks were Baptist."

The more important issue (besides being unaware of their existence) was learning how they were treated. Faced with racial prejudice, at times they were denied communion for fear the white parishioners in the congregation would be upset. As great a parish as St. Leonard of Port Maurice was (and is), it gave other parishes the supposed excuse to refuse black people joining their parish by telling them they had to go to St. Leonard's or St. Martin's "where they belong". Fr. Farrell, the founder of St. Joan of Arc, was one of those who sent people away, as most of us know.

This gathering is just the beginning of looking at the Church's attitudes and actions relating to race and discrimination. To be able to change, one needs to know what has happened. Knowledge is power and this gathering was the beginning of this knowledge. Next is what needs to be done.

On Sunday evening we had our annual 'Eucharistic Extravaganza,' a multifaceted experience of what Holy Communion is all about. Over forty children preparing for First Communion, with parents in tow, learned how bread and wine is made, had supper with Jesus, heard stories from Moses about Passover and liberation, took a tour of the Church and then they even got to dig in the drawers of the Church sacristy. It ended with a family spagnetti & meatball dinner plus ice cream. It received the ultimate accolade from one of the young participants who proclaimed, "I thought it was going to be really boring, you know like when old people talk about their broken washing machines, but it was really fun!" Thanks to all the volunteers who pulled off something that wasn't boring, this is one of SJA's best events. We look forward to First Communions beginning in a couple of weeks.

Finally, the Gospel says Jesus, is the Good Shepherd who sees no distinction between his sheep; lets us try that.
