Pastors 2 Cents From: Fr. Jim DeBruycker

I'm sure most of you have heard the expression, "they will eat you alive." It can be a compliment in the sense of "go for it if you want, but you don't understand what you are up against" or an insult, as in "you are way outmatched you fool, its suicide". I think of these whenever I read today's Gospel.

*I am the living bread that came down from heaven;
whoever eats this bread will live forever;
and the bread that I will give
is my flesh for the life of the world.*

On one level John is presenting a Eucharistic Manifesto. In typical John fashion, he is letting you know that the Eucharist is truly the presence of Christ sacramentally; it is real substance. But he is also proclaiming that the bodily Jesus is the real presence of the Father made flesh into the world.

By the end of the Gospel proclamation, the people understand both, and they are having a hard time accepting it. He had just fed the 5000 and walked on water, but it says even then his followers had a hard time with who he claimed to be. As a result of this, many of his disciples returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied him.

The person of Jesus as the word made flesh is very important to John's theology. For Jesus to complete his work in the world means he is truly the God/Man. His union of the divine and human raises up humanity when he freely offers himself as the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world. He is going to let the powers that be, "eat him alive."

This idea of redemption has fallen on hard times over the years. It seems awful messy. But if you think of most of our great liberators, they have walked into messes out of which many did not emerge alive...or they were later assassinated.

Today's feast of the Body and Blood of Christ is a celebration of Christ's presence as the Sacrament of God and the Eucharist as the Sacrament of Christ. It is also a reminder that the Church should be the presence of Christ acting in the world.

The tradition of the Eucharistic Procession is a symbolic celebration of that fact, be it the simple walking through the aisles of the Church or processing through the streets of the city. Christ in the Church, Christ out into the streets.

Finally, thanks for your continued patience with the ongoing building project and last week's power outages.

ISAIAH Action Alert Today: Stop by tables outside the gym entrances for info on the proposed repeal of health care as well as legislation that would prohibit the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau from regulating the payday lending industry - which we know has such a huge impact on low-income families. ISAIAH is a collective of more than 90 metro area churches working together for racial and economic justice - please join us!

SJA Outreach Fund: This is the Good News! Last week we celebrated the work of our Outreach Fund, and we thank all the organizations and parishioners who joined us to lift up our powerful commitment to healing and transformation in our world. For those of you who couldn't join us, you missed our beautiful candlelit service in the gym (power outage in South Minneapolis!), but here is the work we support:

- Our CARE Committee: We provide emergency financial assistance to parishioners and neighbors in need (\$72,000 yearly).
- Justice Grant Recipients: In 2016, we awarded 20 grants to organizations in which our parishioners are committed volunteers and leaders. (\$80 – 100,000 yearly).
- Mental Health Connect: We helped fund the successful pilot phase of this community based mental health resource and referral center (\$5000 this fiscal year).
- Sustaining Partners: We are proud of deep relationships with these four organizations – Sister Parish; Women Against Military Madness; Mobile Loaves Twin Cities and Arm in Arm in Africa (\$15,000 yearly)

We are grateful to all the parishioners who administer these funds, to the organizations with which we partner, and to all our donors.

SJA Outreach Fund: This is the REALLY GOOD News! Parish-

ioner Rita Benak belongs to a group called Power of 100, in which women select charities to support and everyone writes a check for \$100. This week Rita presented to the group about the work of Mobile Loaves Twin Cities (a Sustaining Partner organization of the SJA Outreach Fund). Out of the charities that were suggested that evening, the group chose to support Mobile Loaves Twin Cities, and their contributions were partially matched by the Richard Schulze Foundation. The happy ending to this story is that Mobile Loaves Twin Cities will receive approximately \$30,000 - almost half of their operating budget for the year! And because MLTC is totally run by volunteers, 95% of that budget goes to purchasing food so that every month more than 3000 hot and nutritious meals can be served to people in need in our community. Isn't this incredible? Congratulations to Rita, to all the supporters of Power of 100, and to everyone at our Sustaining Partner, Mobile Loaves Twin Cities.

Race: The Power of an Illusion. On Wednesday, June 28, we will screen the third part of our film series (no need to have seen parts 1 or 2), *The House We Live In*. The film examines the policies and institutions we have built to enshrine inequality. Discussion will follow. Join us for a powerful evening together.

A Conversation with Mitch Walking Elk: The Long March to Rome. On Sunday, July 9, our guest speaker/musician is Mitch Walking Elk. Mitch is leading a youth delegation to the Vatican to meet with Pope Francis and discuss their continued effort to abolish two papal orders, or bulls, that have been in place for more than 500 years. These papal bulls have been invoked in the continuous domination and extermination of indigenous people around the world (FFI, go to longmarchtorome.com). Join us for an after-mass Q & A with Mitch Walking Elk and learn more about this prophetic work.

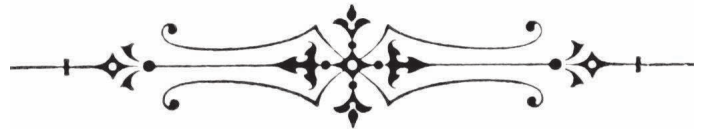
