Pastors 2 Cents From: Fr. Jim DeBruycker

Today is the iconic St. Peter story. He takes a risk and when he loses heart, he starts to sink and Jesus saves him. For Peter, this seemed to be the motif of his life until the very end.

It bemuses me and terrifies me when people feel they have to defend their God, be it Yahweh, Allah or Jesus. I am confused by people who kill, torture, and imprison others because of their beliefs. It seems to me that part of belief includes the idea that their God could defend Godself and wouldn't need anyone to run interference for them. It's not much of a God if God can't take care of Godself.

Of course, the reason one needs to hurt others in the name of their God is because they are not sure themselves. It has to do more with their ego than God's need.

St. Peter would die laughing at the great statues of himself as a mighty bishop with gilded crozier and miter. Have you ever noticed as the church got more conservative the miters got higher and higher? My old Lutheran office mate at the hospital used to call it 'miter envy.' She fought the Lutheran church joining up with the Episcopalians because she always said she worried about the Lutheran bishops having miter envy of the Catholics and Episcopalians.

Peter was not the rigid authoritarian. Rather, he was the hot-headed, good intentioned believer who continued to make the wrong decisions but had the humility to fall down in tears and ask forgiveness. His authority didn't come from perfection but from a heart open to forgiveness.

The famous sea side conversation where the resurrected Jesus asked Peter three times, "Do you love me?" was both an accusation and a window to understanding Peter and whence his authority came – from forgiveness and that was Peter's door to the souls of followers.

God is not to be found in some great victorious battle but in the quiet solitude of knowing that we are forgiven; that we are one with God and each other. It's the gentle quiet whispering breeze of Elijah and the invitation from God to a tear stained sinner to "feed my sheep".

Catholic Social Teaching: A Reflection On Our Foundation and Our Future

There's no denying that many of us are overwhelmed by the pace and urgency of the issues that face our world and demand action. We are grateful for even a little bit slower pace in August, when we take a breath and give thanks for the beauty of the world and the goodness of so many in our midst. Our faith calls us to these times of renewal, and our Catholic tradition offers us a powerful lens through which to see the world as God sees it and respond as a human family. These are the principles of Catholic Social Teaching, a powerful blueprint for the days ahead. We offer them in a very distilled format today:

Human Dignity: Each of us is created in the image and likeness of our loving God. This is our foundation.

Common Good: We realize our human dignity in community. Everyone has an obligation to contribute to the good of the whole society.

Option for the Poor: The moral test of our society is how we treat our most vulnerable members. The poor and marginalized have the most urgent claim on the conscience of the nation.

Rights and Responsibilities: Every person has a fundamental right to what is needed to live in dignity – life, food, shelter, health care, education, employment. We also have a right and a responsibility to participate in our public life together.

Role of Government: The state has a positive moral function as an instrument to promote human dignity, protect human rights and build the common good.

Economic Justice: The economy must serve people, not the other way around. All workers have the right to decent and fair wages and safe working conditions. No one is allowed to amass excessive wealth when others lack the basic necessities of life.

Stewardship of God's Creation: We are called to protect people and the planet and to live our faith in right relationship with all of God's creation.

Promotion of Peace and Disarmament: Peace is not just the absence of war. Peace is the fruit of justice.

Global Solidarity: We are called to work together globally for the good of the human family in an interdependent world.

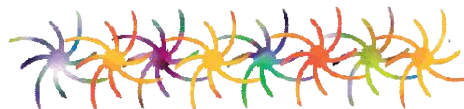
