Pastors 2 Cents From: Fr. Jim DeBruycker

If there were a name for the first Sunday after Epiphany, Discipleship Sunday would be a good name. Jesus is recognized as God incarnate on the feast of the Epiphany, and that epiphany is consecrated on the feast of The Baptism of the Lord with a theophany, God-speaking, "You are my beloved Son, with you I am well pleased." This is accompanied, of course, by the dove-like Descent of the Holy Spirit.

Today, John points out Jesus to a number of his disciples, who leave him to follow Jesus. Most notable of these is Simon whom he renames Cephas in Greek, Petras in Latin, or Peter in English, all meaning Rock, or dare we say...Rocky.

In later weeks he will call the other disciples with the invitation, "Come, follow me," meaning, "Come, be me to other people; take my place". Of course, this week we combine this call to discipleship with the call of Samuel, with that poignant story of young Samuel hearing his name called in the middle of the night unaware that it is the Lord.

Clergy and religious often score high in narcissism scale on the Minnesota Multiphasic Personality Inventory, or MMPI. Of course we do! We are told we have a calling from God-if that's not grandiosity and self-importance, I don't know what is. But in all honesty, we *all* are called in some way. We all have a task in life to, in our own way, live out God's plan for us.

We are all like Samuel; the voice of God is calling and we need to find out where and how to answer. The call may come as a personal challenge such as a personal knot to untie or a decision or situation which calls us to action. No one is excused. Somehow, each of us can be Christ to another.

I am reminded of St. Therese's prayer:

May today there be peace within.

May you trust God that you are exactly where you are meant to be.

May you not forget the infinite possibilities that are born of faith.

May you use those gifts that you have received and pass on the love that has been given to you.

May you be content knowing you are a child of God.

Let this presence settle into your bones and allow your soul the freedom to sing, dance, praise and love.

It is there for each and every one of us.

in Guatemala to travel here to Minnesota were denied travel visas by the U.S. embassy (including one woman who came with a delegation in 2013). Sister Parish staff and potential delegates go through an extensive process to apply for visas, including letters and phone calls of support from Sen. Amy Klobuchar and Rep. Keith Ellison's office. We do not know the reasons for this denial and no rationale was given. It is always a blow to receive such news, but we will be ready for our brother Pedro and our sister Olga as they become the first Guatemalans to join us in the winter! There will be many opportunities for parishioners to join our days together, including parish potlucks on Sunday, Feb. 11 and 18.
