Pastors 2 Cents From: Fr. Jim DeBruycker

Experience is the best teacher. Necessity is the mother of invention. 1% genius, 99% perspiration. Learn from your mistakes. One could go on and on with clichés about progress, but at the heart of all these clichés is the fact that everything is connected. We build on what we know, sometimes because it works so well and sometimes because it is an unmitigated disaster.

There is a commercial for dish/satellite TV which presents a number of people doing stupid things repeatedly, inferring that those sticking to cable are obviously stupid for not changing to direct TV. I still have cable.

Let's face it - we all do stupid things that are self-destructive to various degrees. Many of us are killing ourselves with our different forms of consumption, be it food or self-delusions. Why do we hate going to the doctor? We don't want to step on the scale and have that lecture about controlling our intake of our favorite poison; fatty foods, alcohol, or cigarettes, to name a few. For a while at Hennepin, we had a favorite general practice doc who smoked and was overweight; we went to him hoping he would not lecture us.

To change means we have to give something up or die to some kind of destructive behavior. Nobody likes to die to anything. There is an old light bulb joke: How many bishops does it take to change a light bulb? The answer - Change? It's uncomfortable, it's stress-producing, and it may make us realize how stupid or stubborn we really have been.

The Gospel tells us that unless a grain of wheat dies and is buried, it cannot produce much fruit. It isn't rocket science to see how that relates to all of us.

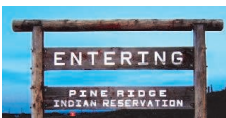
