Pastors 2 Cents From: Fr. Jim DeBruycker

It might be Post Pascal Stress Disorder (PPSD), but I forgot to thank everyone involved in our Lenten and Holy Week celebrations. It's not always easy working with 'creative' types, but I'm thankful for their work and I would especially like to thank our maintenance crew who worked overtime making sure the church in its half-done state was usable.

In today's Gospel we get the second part of a story. The two travelers on the road to Emmaus have just reached the apostles to report on their meeting of Jesus, when he reappears in their midst. Once again he greets them with, "Peace be with you."

One often wonders if Luke left out details about the Emmaus encounter on purpose. Where was Emmaus? Who are the two travelers? Why didn't they recognize Jesus? Did Luke realize he was providing fodder for retreat masters for the next two thousand years? For a parish whose unofficial mission statement is, "We welcome you wherever you are on your journey," this story should be our official foundational one.

The theologian Karl Rahner took to heart Jesus' statement, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." In attempting to explain how there can be salvation outside the institutional Church, Rahner maintained that someone who is searching for the truth with complete integrity is searching for Jesus, because He is the source of all truth.

The institutional Church was of course upset by this and unbelievers, whom he called 'anonymous Christians', were offended. You can't win when you try to do the right thing. But what does Jesus mean by peace? Of course, we all wish it meant total tranquility, where all lived in mutual respect, had a home and could be safe. This is the goal, the dream. But Jesus also knew this was not yet the world we...or they lived in.

The peace Jesus wished on them was a life where they lived for the kingdom to come. A life where one can be at peace with one's self because, to the best of their ability, they tried to do the right thing or tried to find the right answer to life's questions. All of this, tempered by the ethical consideration to treat others the way you would like to be treated.

Under those considerations, I would welcome anyone wherever they are on their journey and I think Jesus would too. Peace!

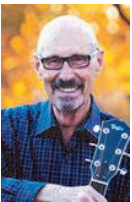
