Pastor's 2 Cents From: Fr. Jim DeBruycker

Today Luke continues his story of the Spirit of God at work in the world. He addresses it to the God lovers (Greek: Theophilus) so they can understand better the Spirit's working. The Spirit which entered Mary at the Annunciation, descended on Jesus at his Baptism, and spoke at the Transfiguration, is now about to enter the disciples and the Church.

Our stained glass windows in the church show a similar story (forgive me if I have written about this before.) They start with Adam and Eve and sin entering the world. Next, God offers help to us with the law of Moses in the Ten Commandments which did not work so well, so God came himself in The Nativity. The Spirit commissions Jesus at the Baptism of the Lord and in the Preaching by the Lake window, he calls his disciples who will ultimately take his place.

Following these are two great miracles: Turning Water into Wine and Healing of the Cripple. Then we see his glory at the Transfiguration, the Agony in the Garden, his final self-sacrifice in the Crucifixion with the ultimate victory over death in the Resurrection. Of course, the culmination of the story is Pentecost, with the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the disciples gathered in the upper room, representing the Church as the presence of Christ in the world.

The final window, an anchor with a heart in the middle, is more symbolic than the rest. The church is often portrayed as a boat tossed in the waves, but it is also firmly anchored in faith with the heart of Jesus at its core, or the love of God. As stained glass is supposed to do, it depicts the Gospel in pictures, so all that daydreaming during mass isn't wasted.

Of course, the ultimate message is that we have taken on the mantle of Jesus in the world. The people are his presence, the Church building is symbolic of that presence in the world, and the sacraments are celebrations of that presence and nourishment on the journey. While a building is not necessary for this to happen, I hope the remodeling of the Church helps to highlight this presence, this story, this journey.

Over the past two weeks, we have had the privilege to celebrate with our children making their first communion. This is a milestone in faith, coming to the table in full communion. As all things in faith it is a promise and a challenge, the promise of the final great beloved community coming to fruition and our part in making it happen.

Jesus has left us to go to the Father, but his Spirit is always with us, guiding us. You never really learn how to drive or fly until you solo, but the guidance of the teacher is always with you.

Archbishop Hebda has accepted our invitation to visit SJA and will be here for the 11am Mass on Sunday, May 27. Watch next week's bulletin for more info.


