Pastor's 2 Cents From: Fr. Jim DeBruycker

This past week Sr. Roseanne Fox died. For twenty years, I had coffee and doughnuts with Sr. Roseanne, Sr. Doris, Sr. Joel and Sr. Dennis, all who were a big part of outreach at St. Olaf's downtown. I never ceased to be surprised at who I would meet in their basement offices. One day it could be a Pohlad, the next, Senator Durenberger, but most of the time it would be a street person or someone desperate for assistance.

Sr. Dennis would drag me to 315 Hennepin to anoint one of her people, chiding me for being so wary of the central courtyard, stories below - it had the lowest safety railing I had ever seen. I also would go with them when they had lunch at the Gay Nineties, where they were treated like royalty and shown great deference. I, the priest, was usually welcomed with a "What do you want?" Many times I would see Dennis or Doris walking downtown in places where most people wouldn't feel comfortable walking alone. The sisters had a certain charisma that kept them safe, I guess.

Sr. Roseanne would sometimes invite me along as she went to pick up furniture donated by a family cleaning up an estate and she would let me assess the antiques. As the furniture was loaded up by her ever present aid, Prescott Little, she would give the address where that furniture was desperately needed. You might be surprised to learn how more than a few people in need ended up with a Stickley dining room table.

Countless times I would call and tell her about a family that was stranded due to an accident or a health incident at Hennepin Medical Center. Roseanne would arrange for a place for them to stay and then went the extra mile by taking them out to eat.

She also had great street smarts; she knew when she was being conned. One day, a young man came to the door asking for money to buy a ticket to Rochester for an appointment at the Mayo Clinic in an hour's time. Sister asked him how long he knew about this appointment and he said two weeks. "Well," she replied, "that was poor planning on your part, so when you make a new appointment you will plan better." She shut the door, leaving the young man empty handed and surprised. "Most panhandlers are ten year old boys who forgot their homework" she told me. "Besides, he was here last week to find money for a ticket to his grandma's funeral."

I could write a book about these four women who were such a powerful force for good. Starting as educators, they created new careers in pastoral care, pioneering the outreach roles that have become part of our parishes. So often we hear negative stories of the Church and we forget the powerful witness so many are giving each day. The passing of someone like Sr. Roseanne leaves a void, but also a great witness.

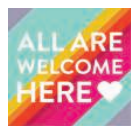
