Pastor's 2 Cents From: Fr. Jim DeBruycker

I probably shouldn't admit to this, but I have been streaming *Westworld* on HBO. Aside from the gratuitous violence and nudity, it raises a lot of questions about what it means to be aware, to be truly free and what is our fundamental stance towards life. In an adult theme park populated with robots indistinguishable from humans, the robots are becoming aware of who they are... and they are not happy.

In the tenth episode of season one, Anthony Hopkins, who plays the director of the park, leads one of the robots through an analysis of who she is and what roles she played in the park. She had already come to an awareness because she was starting to retain memories from previous experiences. Imagine finding out that your meaning was nothing more than a story line.

In this episode Hopkins also shows her a large print of Michelangelo's fresco, *The Creation of Adam*, you know, the one with the fingers touching. He asks her to look at the shape of God's figure, the flowing garment, and his entire retinue. It becomes evident after a while that the shape formed is an anatomically correct representation of the human brain.

The *Westworld* writers didn't come up with this idea. It seems it originated from an article in the Journal of the American Medical Association written by gynecologist, Dr. Frank Lynn Meshberger. He conjectured that just as how Copernicus' noting of the earth circling the sun destroyed the old hierarchical firmament model, so Michelangelo was destroying the idea everything was transmitted to us through the Church; the divine directly touches us through the brain. It was pretty revolutionary for the time. I also may have watched too many *In Search of Ancient Aliens* episodes.

In the readings today we have the story of humankind's awareness of sin. A number of the analytical psychologists see this as the presentation of a person becoming aware of being aware, of seeing themselves as separate. Humanity will be a foreigner to oneself from now on and forever seek to be one again. The snake said they would become like God and he was not lying. We are now aware; we can wonder but also know fear.

As aware people, how do we put ourselves back together again? Jesus says there is only one unforgivable sin and that is despair- to steal hope from a person, but the Spirit of God can and is working in the world to make us whole. Are we one up on the robots?

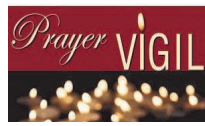
