Pastor's 2 Cents From: Dennis Heaney

Father DeBruycker and our new Stewardship Committee thought the SJA community should have interim reports on our recent •Build •Gather•Grow capital campaign. This first report, prepared by SJA Finance Manager, Nancy McPherson, gives you an overview of the campaign in total money raised and pledged, along with the money collected and the pledge balance yet to be collected:

Campaign Duration: 3 years March 2017 - Feb 2020
 Campaign Target: \$2,998,200
 Number of Pledges: 1,055
 Pledge Commitments: \$3,005,072
 Pledges Collected: \$2,289,400
Pledges Left to Collect: \$715,672

We've been pleasantly surprised – and blessed – by the number of parishioners who made three year pledges during the campaign and have already paid them off.

The number of parishioners who contributed cash and stock during the campaign, or paid pledges early, enabled us to pay cash for the construction and interior design work of our Welcome Center as well as most of the church restoration. In order to complete the work on the church, including the new sound system, we negotiated a construction loan with Bremer Bank using the balance of pledges as collateral.

To date we have borrowed \$400,000 on that loan and the SJA Finance Committee has asked that we do not increase the borrowing until we have more pledge income in the bank and a better read on the impact the new tax laws will have on charitable giving. With that in mind, we are holding off on remodeling the Egan Room kitchen as well as further work on the gym sound system.

Also on the topic of “money”, let me update you on a column I wrote in August about our projected shortfall for the fiscal year 2018/19. I wrote that our income at the time was \$16,000 below budget and \$25,000 below same time last year. While I didn't “beg” (overtly!) I did ask that parishioners consider their current giving.

Within a week – literally – a very generous parishioner couple sent us a stock gift of \$30,000 “to help with the shortfall”. The generosity of the SJA parishioners is inspiring, humbling and moving. It gives witness to how important this community is to each of us and it makes a strong statement about how we want SJA to be here and welcoming for those who follow us.

On behalf of Fathers DeBruycker and Cassidy, as well as a very grateful SJA staff, thank you for your encouragement and support.
