Pastor's 2 Cents From: Brennan Hall, SJA Youth Ministry Coordinator

There is no doubt that the Catholic Church is at a pivotal point. We know all the stories, the headlines, and the ups and downs that are felt across our church. We also know that many stories pass without comment from those in power. But I can tell you one thing: our SJA young people are ready to stir the pot.

Over the last 12 months, 37 young people have explored through ritual, formation, reflection and discernment what it means to live as a person of faith. They explored what beliefs, practices, and values are at the heart of Catholicism. They reflected on their experiences of faith, religion, and spirituality and connected them to current ideas and their own reality as teenagers. They slept outside on April 20 among the last few snow banks and a low temperature of 28 degrees for our "A Journey Home Retreat". They advocated for people experiencing homelessness by writing letters to their representatives and they raised close to \$6,000 for the SJA Care Fund.

Each confirmation session offers time to discuss, listen and reflect with their peers and leaders. We hope that they each grow as a person and as a Christian, finding what they desire from our church community.

To help them prepare for a continued journey in faith and service to others, our confirmands participate in three different service experiences of their choice. They are also expected to engage in our community at St. Joan of Arc through three different events, meetings or celebrations. This might be something such as attending a speakers presentation, a concert, a prayer service, a rally for justice, etc. The possibilities are almost endless!

However our young people didn't just go through the motions—they have asked questions. They reached out, asking why they should remain Catholic in light of so many reasons to disagree. Their questions are valid and at, there is no simple answer.

But one thing is clear to our confirmands: the Saint Joan of Arc Catholic Community makes them feel welcome and safe.

Time and time again, the youth have shared how grateful they are to be a part of the welcoming and inclusive family that is SJA. As we hear from them today, prior to the Rite of Confirmation on Sunday, November 18, may you be blessed knowing what a difference you, the SJA community, have made in their lives.

Stir the pot. Ask questions. Seek answers. Continue on your journey in faith!
