## Pastor's 2 Cents From: Fr. Jim DeBruycker

The time from the late seventies into the early eighties was the golden age of self-help theories. If you were in the helping professions, you were into Gestalt Theory, getting in touch with your feelings (let's all break into dyads now), recovered memories, Transcendental Meditation & Transactional Analysis, and/or co-dependency. God knows I had my chakras realigned more than a few times. I even found my animal familiar with the help of a native healer - a raven; they cackle and hang around death a lot.

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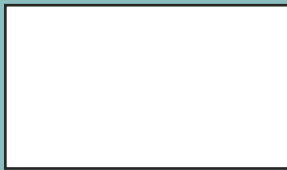
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
