Pastor's 2 Cents From: Fr. Jim DeBruycker

"He doth protest too much!" We have all heard and used that expression at some time in our life. It usually refers to someone who tries to deflect us from noticing their own personal failures by pointing out another's faults, often being the very same faults they themselves are trying to hide.

In psychology, when you are not cognitive of this ruse, it's called projection; seeing your faults in others and then calling them out. A little reflection on recent politics could give us plenty of examples. Its hard to decide which is worse, the active deceiver or the person who deceives themselves.

Jesus comments on this phenomenon a number of times in scripture, be it the hypocrisy of the power structure which usurps the religious and civil law for its own enrichment, or the fearful retribution of the forgiven debtor who wreaks vengeance on those in debt to them. With no subtlety at all, Jesus suggests today that they take the plank out of their own eye before they go after the speck in another's eye.

Most of us get involved in this deception, not out of conscious evil, but fear. The fear of the person forgiven a debt, who hopes they can save themselves by getting the little they are owed from another. The fear of someone who cannot own their own weakness, or fear of discovery of that weakness, which makes them try to destroy another.

We have to ask ourselves when something makes us crazy-angry, what is really making us so upset? It could be the irrationality of the act or it could be the fear of it in ourselves. Our recent viral homophobic response to a simple video makes me ask the question, why so much hatred and anger?

This coming Wednesday is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent. We will put what I call 'holy dirt' on each other's foreheads, not to say we are evil but that we are created, not God. We are breakable, imperfect vessels: we need to forgive ourselves and others and take care of each other. We ask ourselves, what is keeping us apart? What is the source of our animosity?

We are continuing our Advent theme of recognizing "we are exactly where we are supposed to be." It seemed to cause just enough consternation among us to continue questioning. How can I be of service here and now wherever I am on my journey? Can I accept myself now as being of God?

Finally, thanks for your prayers, although it seems there is a little more journey left in this cancer story. Tumors have reappeared and I will need some more surgery in a couple of weeks.
