Pastor's 2 Cents From: Fr. Jim DeBruycker

"May today there be peace within. May you trust God that you are exactly where you are meant to be. May you not forget the infinite possibilities that are born of faith. May you use those gifts that you have received, and pass on the love that has been given to you. May you be content knowing you are a child of God. Let this presence settle into your bones, and allow your soul the freedom to sing, dance, praise and love. It is there for each and every one of us."

It may be lack of imagination, but we decided to continue to use Teresa's prayer once again as our Lenten theme. Whenever you type in a street address on your GPS, it always wants to know what your location is first. It can't find a route until it knows where to start from. You are exactly where you are meant to be because you have no option to be but where you are. So where are you, do you know? Do you want to be here? What are the gifts and blessings of this moment? What is the downside? Do you have control of the situation? Do you really need control? Have you just received one of life's curve balls? Now what?

I love those comic organizational decision charts, like one that might ask: Did you originate the problem? Yes. >Does anyone know it was you? No. >Good. Or, if you answer Yes. >Can you lie about it? No. >Too bad. Sad to say, life can be more like this than we care to admit.

Teresa spent most of her life in a male dominated society where her opinion was dismissed. She was descended from Jews who had been more or less forced to convert to Catholicism, known as *conversi*. She was always on the verge of being condemned as a heretic, both by reason of her heritage and her overwhelming belief and experience of God's love in her prayer, which was way too personal and emotional for the legalistic hierarchy of her day.

Her response to these challenges was the above prayer. She knew her limitations. She knew her gifts and where she was right now and how she could overcome limitations and use her gifts for the best. And no matter what, if she was making these decisions with integrity, God was always with her...no matter the outcome.

The alternative way of living is the temptation of the devil in today's Gospel: the quest to always have what you don't have and more of it; to have complete control, and absolute power. Let me tell you, you will never get there.
