Pastor's 2 Cents From: Fr. Jim DeBruycker

As he rode along, the people were spreading their cloaks on the road; and now as he was approaching the slope of the Mount of Olives, the whole multitude of his disciples began to praise God aloud with joy for all the mighty deeds they had seen. They proclaimed: "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord. Peace in heaven and glory in the highest."

Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to him, "Teacher, rebuke your disciples."

He said in reply, "I tell you, if they keep silent, the stones will cry out!"

I quote the above passage from Chapter 40 of Luke's Gospel because of an experience I had at the Church of the Transfiguration on Mt. Tabor in Israel. It is a very old Church, as are many in Israel, and in need of some repair. We were commenting on this, especially one area of the church where the plaster work had fallen away and the stonework exposed. The old monk giving us the tour explained those were the stones which would have cried out.

We thought that was pretty silly but being American tourists, we took out our Swiss army knives and when the guide wasn't looking, carved off a couple of pieces for relics. Somewhere in my house is a box with bits of crying out stones. Given enough time, tourists would carry off Mt. Rushmore.

There were a lot of tourist attractions like that in the Holy Land which begged credibility, such as the footprint in concrete that was supposedly where Jesus launched himself into heaven at the Ascension. I swore I saw 'Miller Concrete' embossed in the concrete.

One of my instructors agreed that many of the sites were questionable, but he maintained it was the faith of the believers which made most of the sites holy, not necessarily their historicity.

So what happened on that secluded mountain so many years ago? Was it as written? The accounts differ in the different Gospels but at the bottom of this story is an experience which confirmed the apostles' faith. After this, they were convinced Jesus was from God and they were following the right man.

I always see this Transfiguration Sunday as an assurance on our Lenten journey that we are on the right track in faith. This is my chosen Son, listen to him.

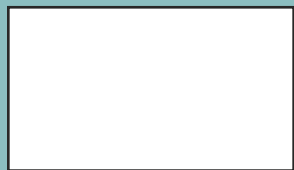
