Pastor's 2 Cents From: Cynthia Bailey Manns

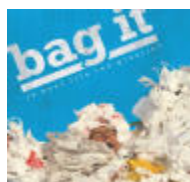
"Leading the flock across the desert, he came to Horeb, the mountain of God. There an angel of the Lord appeared to Moses in fire flaming out of a bush. As he looked on, he was surprised to see the bush, though on fire, was not consumed. So Moses decided, "I must go over to look at this remarkable sight, and see why the bush is not burned."

"This world is on fire!" is a lament I often hear from others and have spoken myself. In today's 1st Reading from Exodus, Moses is in the field tending his sheep when he notices a burning bush that is not being consumed by the flames. Moses intentionally stopped what he was doing, turned aside, and gave the burning bush his undivided attention. Seeing Moses' actions, God calls him by name, "Moses! Moses!" to which Moses answers, "Here I am." God then tells Moses not to come closer until he had removed his shoes, as he was standing on holy ground.

We may ask why the ground was holy, and the simple answer is because God was present. God's presence is everywhere, in everybody, and everything. And 'burning bushes' are all around us. Racial inequality became a burning bush when slaves were brought to this country. Gender inequality became a burning bush when women were seen as property of men. Environmental inequality became a burning bush when it became legal to dump chemical waste into the poorest neighborhoods. Immigration became a burning bush when the US said to migrants, "We will take your labor and love, but we demand you live in the shadows." Economic inequality became a burning bush when we decided that people are less important than what they produce.

Rev. Traci Blackmon reminds us that, "Wherever the cries of the people are heard, bushes are burning." And God is present on the holy ground of all the 'burning bushes'. So, where are the 'burning bushes' in your life? And when do you notice a burning bush, turn aside, hear God call your name, and answer, "Here I am.?"

When we notice the cries of the people, we are turning toward God. We answer, "Here I am. Now what?" We are being called to become God's hands and feet. We are being called to embody God's love for one another. We are exactly where we are meant to be.
