## Pastor's 2 Cents From: Dennis Heaney

In Father DeBruycker's absence, I thought I'd give you a brief update on our capital campaign results. Here is our February 28 report to the Finance Committee:

Campaign Duration	3 years, March 2017 - Feb 2020
Pledge Commitments	\$2,990,932
Number of Pledges	1,055
Pledges Collected	\$2,589,680
Pledges Left to Collect	\$401,452

You may remember that we borrowed \$400,000 and used our pledges as collateral to finish the work on the church restoration. Currently we owe \$150,000 on that loan and will pay it off as pledges are paid. Until the loan is paid off, our additional work on the gym sound system and the potential remodeling of the Egan Room kitchen are on hold.

Thanks to the ongoing generosity of the SJA community, our capital campaign was very successful and the pledges are coming in as promised, some ahead of schedule.

Beyond the capital campaign, how is the rest of our 'financial picture?' Good – and interesting.

Last August, I wrote about a projected shortfall for the current fiscal year. As of February 28, because of the generosity of our community and the diligence of the SJA staff, our income is slightly above budget and our expenses are slightly below budget. We had an unusual number of weekends this winter when the weather was not in our favor, but with the better weather and a few generous special gifts, we're doing okay.

The 'interesting' aspect comes from our Sustaining Member program. Most know that our Sustaining Members (electronic contributions via bank or credit cards) account for almost 50% of our annual collection income. This year we have seen a drop in the number of enrolled parishioners for the first time in a number of years and we're not sure why this is happening. Another reason could be the new tax laws or some choosing to contribute once a year through their Qualified Charitable Distribution from an IRA. We hope to do more research on this issue, but in the meantime, we invite those parishioners who are interested to consider the ease of donating to SJA through our Sustaining Member program. You can find enrollment cards in the Welcome Center, the school hallway, the church vestibule or at the Parish Center front desk.

On behalf of the leadership and staff of SJA thank you for your commitment and enthusiasm. You make the SJA community vibrant and welcoming.
