Pastor's 2 Cents From: Julie Madden

I've been re-reading "The Last Week: A Day by Day Account of Jesus' Last Week in Jerusalem" by John Dominic Crossan and Marcus Borg, and am knocked out by their description of the contrasting processions into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday. Pontius Pilate's military entrance from the west was "a demonstration of the domination systems of the empire that ruled the world. Jesus' peasant procession embodied an alternative vision, a vision of the already present and coming kingdom of God." Jesus' proclamation of this vision made him an enemy of the empire. Such proclamations still do.

And here at St. Joan of Arc today, we have two compelling and beautiful iterations of the story of Jesus' last days. In the gym, we give thanks for the presence of Robert Robinson, our SJA choir and musicians, and the readers who will share the story of the passion. In the church, families have partnered once again with the In The Heart of the Beast Mask and Puppet Theatre, under Gabrielle Dane's direction, in an incredibly creative depiction of the meaning and message of Jesus' life that includes the puppets and visuals for which HOTB is renowned. Thanks to all who have been involved, and all who join us for worship today.

This will be a powerful Holy Week here at St. Joan of Arc, and we hope you will join us beginning with our celebrations of the Seder meal and Holy Thursday and continuing through our contemporary stations of the cross on Good Friday. Then our Easter Vigil service on Saturday evening will bring us from the darkness into the light with our essential symbols of fire and the water of baptism. And Easter Sunday proclaims our great Alleluia!

In the words of our Lenten guide, Teresa of Avila, Jesus was exactly where he needed to be to fulfill God's vision for humanity - in his life, his death and resurrection. Can we embrace this certainty as well, and move forward to where God calls us go? This can demand a trust in God beyond all imagining. We have all been at points in our own lives, and in the life of our community, when such trust is demanded of us so that we may joyfully fulfill God's dreams for us and for the world. Holy Week is a time to re-center ourselves in the conviction that we are indeed where we are meant to be.

As we begin, keep in mind these words from "The Last Week": "Holy Week and the journey of Lent are about an alternative procession and an alternative journey. They enable us to see the passion of Jesus, which was the kingdom of God. It is the world that the prophets dreamed of - a world where everyone has enough and systems are fair. It is a world that begins with a deep centering in God, which frees us from fear."

Take a deep breath and stay with us until the stone is rolled away; be not afraid

And know that (spoiler alert) love wins. It still does
