## Pastor's 2 Cents From: Fr. Jim DeBruycker

*Thomas answered and said to him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed."*

Jesus is complimenting us with this statement. The disciples who were with Jesus, living with him each day, even they had a problem believing, but you who have not had that experience believe without having seen all that they saw.

I'm not saying it's easy to have faith these days with all the controversy in the Church. Even the two living popes seem to be feuding with each other. We used to read about this stuff in medieval history but it is coming alive in our own time. Will we end up with an anti-pope?
