## Pastor's 2 Cents From: Fr. Jim DeBruycker

Today's reading for me is the heart of the Gospel. Jesus is raised; the disciples, in one sense are relieved, but in another sense are depressed-they did not make the grade. For the most part, they ran and hid when the going got tough.

Jesus does not let them off the hook. He doesn't say much to his followers about this, except to Peter, whom he taunts with his three fold question of love, mimicking Peter's threefold betrayal. But the conversation is indicative of what it means to follow Jesus.

Peter the betrayer becomes Peter the true leader of the Church, not because he is the Rock of Matthew's Gospel, but because he is the forgiven one in John's Gospel. I will always maintain that Judas could have been one of our greatest saints if he would have asked for forgiveness rather than having despaired of it. Imagine the symbol he would have been for those starting over. Think of Dismas asking for forgiveness from the cross.

Peter's mandate is that of the head and chief forgiver. He is to give hope to all that there is always the possibility of new beginnings; the good shepherd is always out looking for that lost sheep. The story of the saints is this story: how many times has someone in history hit that dead end in life, hit bottom, and then somehow found the hope to rise above their circumstances to holiness and greatness?

It also reminds us that no one is excused from ministry. Everyone has some gift that they can share to give hope, some experience which lets us know we can overcome obstacles to goodness. As the Church, we have to ask ourselves if that is the message we are giving to the world. Sometimes, as Church, we seem better able to describe who belongs and who doesn't.

Thanks to all who made our Easter celebrations this year so meaningful and to our RCIA candidates who received Baptism and Confirmation. It's always reassuring that we have people willing to commit in faith. Thanks also to Frs. Cassidy and Nosbush for covering for me during my recent health issues.
