Pastor's 2 Cents From: Fr. Jim DeBruycker

As any Religious Ed. teacher will tell you, kids are pretty perceptive when they are paying attention - attention being the operative word. This fourth week of Easter is often called 'Good Shepherd Sunday,' because the Lectionary reading is a version of the Good Shepherd parable.

A number of years ago I was leading a discussion of this reading with some fifth graders in a Religious Ed. class. A young man raised his hand with a comment. "Doesn't a shepherd guard the sheep so that someday he will eat them? So really, what difference does it make to the sheep if a wolf eats them or the shepherd?" I believe he is probably a reporter for Mother Jones these days.

I'll also bet this kid was the first to question the existence of Santa Claus and the Easter Bunny.

In the old days, a question like that would have you writing 100 times why you should not talk back to Father, but this is the age when even the most inane question gets the politically correct response, "That's a good question." In this case, it was a legitimate question. Being a good Democrat, I could have explained that it's the owners who eat the sheep not the worker, (once again the worker is the pawn) but this kid was too smart. So I fell back on every teacher's emergency response, "What do you think?"

Luckily, the kid already saw I was wounded and didn't go in for the kill. The rest of the class was a discussion of how they all hated lamb and they couldn't kill one as they were too cute, but a great religious analogy was in shambles.

It reminded me of another poor Religion teacher who was reading a story about animals. One of the animals was a good squirrel who risked his life for the others. When the teacher asked for a comment, a weary but world-wise child responded, "He was just a good squirrel, but I suppose he was supposed to be Jesus." How quickly they learn.

The earliest Christian representation of Jesus was a young beardless shepherd with a lost lamb thrown over his shoulders. I'm taking it for granted he was saving it, not eating it.

The ancient world was very sheep conscious. They knew they were not the smartest animals and every predator was after them but they were food and warmth. They needed guidance and protection. A shepherd was a rough loner who lived in the elements and lived to protect their sheep. Their sheep saw them as one of them and they responded to the shepherd as one of them. It was a rotten poorly paid and dangerous occupation with little respect. This is the image Jesus took for himself and, as we saw last week, passed on to his disciples.

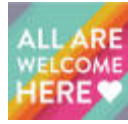
