Pastor's 2 Cents From: Fr. Jim DeBruycker

When I left the Vianney Center, the mental health institute for the very, very nervous and OCD clergy and religious, I received a written evaluation. I probably should not share this with you, but one of the observations was that I have narcissistic tendencies. Oh really? Finally, I have something in common with our president. After all, it's all about me, isn't it?

My response to this observation is? It's probably true... and also probably an occupational hazard. As clergy, we are supposedly personally called by God to be God's chosen vessels here on earth. That's pretty heady stuff. If you don't temper that concept with a sense of ministry to service, you can be in a lot of trouble.

I was blessed to have gone to the seminary when the idea of personal, divine selection was placed way down on the list of qualifications for ministry. You only put on a collar for hospital ministry, and only after you were ordained a Deacon. Your *service* was your identity, not your collar. I only hope, despite my narcissism, I lived up to that expectation.

What brought this to mind was this week's Gospel: Jesus' promise of the Holy Spirit to his disciples. He is preparing them for his imminent departure and the passing on of the Gospel mission to them, and ultimately to us. Once again, he offers to them the gift of peace.

So, how do we know what is God's will and not just our own personal preferences sanctified for our own self-service? As I have previously mentioned, Frederic Marten's book, *The Vatican Closet*, shows, if nothing else, the story of how unbridled power corrupts and allows us to do evil, fooling even ourselves with distorted justification.

At the very least, we must ask ourselves, "How do our beliefs or actions support the common good? Does our teaching encourage or discourage? Is it enlivening or deadening to the human spirit? Does it serve my needs or everyone's?"

To Jesus, peace is the tranquility brought about by living a life of integrity. It may not mean living in a world without conflict-sometimes right action is dangerous-but it does mean tranquility of the soul. Like our greatest moral leaders, be it Ghandi, Martin Luther King, or Mandela, Jesus found peace in the midst of strife. Is it me or the Spirit?
