Today's celebration of Pentecost marks Jesus' followers being given the gift of the Holy Spirit. Despite many having no common language, they were able to understand one another. Through this they began their earthly ministry to all people.

As Jesus' followers today, it can be scary to step outside our normal and experience something new. Through our Faith Formation programs at SJA, we strive to offer new ways for our youth to experience faith. This past year, we implemented a youth ministry blog, *The Journey*, which you can find on our website. Our teens are encouraged to write about things that are important to them. Their voices stretch wide and I encourage you to read their entries.

This year our Confirmandos fundraised for the Justice Fund, learned about redlining in our area, and slept in boxes overnight. They also wrote letters to their representatives to raise awareness about the serious issue of homelessness in Minnesota. As it turned out, as the Legislature was coming to a close, a housing bill was passed in the House and five minutes later, rushed to the Senate, where it also passed. The bill, the last to be passed in the 2019 session, provides \$60 million in housing infrastructure bonds for affordable projects across the state. Insiders said it was in large part a product of public voices.

Our voices do matter. We all have the opportunity to change something, to experience something new, and to advocate for our values.

A minimum of six months from the time the date is set to the wedding is necessary in order to complete requirements.
