Pastor's 2 Cents From: Fr. Jim DeBruycker

On a first reading of today's Gospel one could have a feeling of hopelessness. Can I ever be good enough? How can I be perfect? At the pearly gates will Peter say, "I don't even know you."

Recently, I was called into the Archbishop's office - again. It seems one of my brother priests received a copy of a funeral program in which he found a number of aberrations that upset him enough to refer it to the Archbishop. Apparently the complaint mainly involved replacing a non-scripture reading with a secular poem, including some secular music, in particular, *Take Me Out to the Ballgame*, and finally not being specific enough about who is eligible to receive Communion. We will certainly heed the protocols addressing these issues, but be assured that doing so will not impact our commitment to providing personal and caring funeral services. I was also reminded by the Archbishop not to lose Christ in the process of being too personal.

Can I ever be good enough?

When I was in the St. Paul Seminary an older priest, Fr. Quentin Kennedy, came there to live, or more honestly, to die. He had a terrible heart condition and knew he was an inch away from death. He did die, as he lived, at his typewriter composing another angry letter to the editor of some newspaper. He was a well-known curmudgeon and bane of many Catholic editors.

Someone once asked him if he didn't think he overdid it with all the complaining. His response, with the language sanitized was: 'God gives us the most credit for the dumb things we do while trying to do the right thing than for the safe things we do just to get by.'

I wish I lived that philosophy with more courage. Today's reading is not just about following rules. If it was only just about rules, we wouldn't need Jesus-the Torah would suffice and even then, one could question if you were living the intent of the law.

Jesus is telling us that he is the gate and we are to accept the challenge of living an authentic life based on that old but important question, 'What would Jesus do?' Are we risking making fools of ourselves by trying to do the right thing? Do we live our life trying to meet the challenges of the day with the best, just and loving responses? Maybe it's good to remember the story of the servant who was given riches to invest by his master, but instead only buried it.

One Body: A Catholic Initiative to Unify and Amplify Our Voices on Immigration. Churches in the diocese have begun meeting and collaborating to raise a united Catholic voice in solidarity with immigrants in our community. SJA has been at this table, and we hope you will join us to learn more on Sunday, Sept. 15 following the 11am mass in the Upper Room.
