Pastors 2 Cents From: Fr. Jim DeBruycker

*All this was a long time ago, I remember,
And I would do it again, but set down
This set down
This: were we led all that way for
Birth or Death? There was a Birth, certainly
We had evidence and no doubt. I had seen birth and death,
But had thought they were different; this Birth was
Hard and bitter agony for us, like Death, our death.
We returned to our places, these Kingdoms,
But no longer at ease here, in the old dispensation,
With an alien people clutching their gods.
I should be glad of another death.*

T.S.Eliot

This is the last third of Eliot's poem, Journey of the Magi. It is the reflection of a wise man, a magi, who was used to questioning and observing. He doesn't completely understand why or what it all means, but he does know he saw a birth and yet the death of an old way of life.

I am the last person to comment on Eliot the poet, but for a person who lived through the devastation and insanity of WWI and the ennui of a society which learned nothing from it or actively tried not to think of it, Eliot's poem can be seen as the reflection of a man who has seen the edge and hopes for something better.

He knows the truth but does not see it acted upon in the world around him. Have you ever had that feeling? More than once in the last half hour? This is the question which drives our spirituality. What does it mean to encounter Christ?

"Many Journeys, One Family": On Epiphany, we reflect on the journey, both our own journey and the journey of those who live in the shadows, in fear, among us. The U.S. Council of Catholic Bishops has declared January 7-13 as National Migration Week, when we lift up our brothers and sisters who are immigrants, asylees and refugees around the world. Along with all other Catholic parishes in the diocese, we have been asked by Archbishop Hebda to focus especially on the "Dreamers" - the young people whose undocumented parents brought them to the U.S. as children and who contribute so much to our country and our communities. Today we will sign postcards after mass to our legislators urging them to pass the bipartisan Dream Act of 2017 and fix our broken immigration system. There is also an interfaith service at 1pm today at the Basilica to declare that no human being is illegal. Please join us. If you have signed up to ride the bus, that bus will pick you up in the Field School parking lot across 46th St. from SJA. We begin this new year as a journey of solidarity with all our brothers and sisters. Thank you for your presence and prayers for those who call us to be the face of Christ in our world.

Wedding Policies at St. Joan of Arc: Weddings at St. Joan of Arc are provided as a service to members of the parish community. Because of the large number of weddings, it is not possible to provide the services of a Presider or our facilities for people who are not registered parishioners. For a wedding to take place at SJA, it is necessary that one of the engaged couple be a registered member of the parish for at least six months before a wedding date can be set. A date can only be scheduled by one of the priests after an initial interview with the engaged couple. A minimum of six months from the time the date is set to the wedding is necessary in order to complete requirements. In cases where there has been a previous marriage ending in divorce, it is not possible to set the wedding date until notice of an annulment is in hand. FFI call Sherri Stella at the Parish Center.

Sister Parish Delegation: In February, we will welcome two delegates from our Sister Parish in Tierra Nueva Dos in Guatemala. This is the continuation of a 24 year relationship of faith and friendship in which delegations travel back and forth between our parishes. We are saddened to report that two other people who were selected by the parish in Guatemala to travel here to Minnesota were denied travel visas by the U.S. embassy (including one woman who came with a delegation in 2013). Sister Parish staff and potential delegates go through an extensive process to apply for visas, including letters and phone calls of support from Sen. Amy Klobuchar and Rep. Keith Ellison's office. We do not know the reasons for this denial and no rationale was given. It is always a blow to receive such news, but we will be ready for our brother Pedro and our sister Olga as they become the first Guatemalans to join us in the winter! There will be many opportunities for parishioners to join our days together, including parish potlucks on Sunday, Feb. 11 and 18.

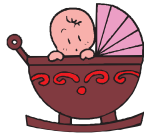
