Pastor's 2 Cents From: Fr. Jim DeBruycker

Everyone knows the old bromide, *'watch out what you pray for, you might get it.'* (I personally could tell you some stories that would curl your toes.) Well, the disciples obviously had not heard this - they were arguing about who was first among them. They must not have listened to Peter's upbraiding in last week's Gospel when he went from a rock of foundation to being a Satan, a road block to salvation. They would have been dismayed at what the cost of discipleship really entails. Jesus is a kind mentor and teacher. He tells them if they want prestige, gain the respect and love of the children, the most defenseless and powerless. In all honesty, the rich and powerful are a lot more treacherous and they are almost impossible to please. Except for John, all disciples would find out the hard way: they all died a martyr's death.

Its hard to avoid conflict in this world-and that's not a bad thing. We all need to be challenged. In an interview, controversial Lutheran Minister, Nadia Bolz-Weber was asked her opinion of Bishops. It was obvious from the way the interviewer asked the question he expected a negative, hopefully controversial response. To paraphrase her response, she said: *I watch a lot of tele-evangelists, men and women who are obviously faith filled but also so full of themselves they have started preaching craziness. They didn't have a good bishop telling them they have gone off the deep end. No, I don't always agree with bishops, but I hope if I go too far someone will intervene.*

Recently an internal 'family' disagreement has developed here at SJA. As most of you know, St. Joan's is a member of ISALIAH, a progressive political action and education group. In many, if not most issues, they represent a St. Joan of Arc point of view. Recently, the city of Minneapolis has a ballot amendment to the city charter calling for a change in how the police department is structured, arising partially out of the George Floyd incident. It seems opinion on this amendment is divided and I would like to say that both sides have legitimate points of view and I feel they are making their arguments with good will. I would never tell someone at St. Joan's how to vote, but you also need to know ISALIAH is not our official representative; we trust their integrity, but there are times when we can honestly disagree. I only say this because there has been some confusion about this, I'm not about to outline the different arguments for and against and the question, *do we have to believe this?* That's your job to decide. 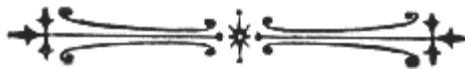
