Pastor's 2 Cents From: Fr. Jim DeBruycker

The great commandment: *The first of all the commandments is, Hear, O Israel The Lord our God is one Lord: And thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind, and with all thy strength: this is the first commandment. And the second is like, namely this, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself. There is none other commandment greater than these.*

The great commandment has two parts. The first is the great prayer of Judaism, the *Shema*, the proclamation there is but one God who alone is holy. The second is a proclamation of the Golden Rule, *Do unto others as you would have them do unto you* or *Love your neighbor as yourself*. At the heart of the second commandment is empathy; to feel what another feels or, as the expression goes, *Walk a mile in their shoes*. There is an old expression, *Beware you understand so well you forgive too much*, meaning, you connect so well with a person and their state of mind, you can forgive their actions-even when they might be immoral. This is the negative aspect of empathy. The positive aspect is to understand so well you feel obliged to find a way to ameliorate the pain or share in the jubilation of an event. It is an ability to see the connectedness of all things.

The second commandment is about empathy and connectedness...but so is the first. In organized religion, there seems to be a need to make God an all-powerful automaton, unchanging and unmoved, a completely unbiased judge, yet caring enough to come to earth, be one of us and die. The great contemplative saints like Teresa of Avila had a more intense relationship. They feel God is probing us. God is not neutral. God is actively engaging us. God wants us. As persons feel another person's state of being, so does God enter us and touch our being. The recognition of this is ecstasy an utter connectedness. We understand God.
